Recycling Bins

New Homeowners must bring a copy of their new deed to get obtain 1 Free round 20-gallon recycling container for bottles & cans and 1 Free rectangular 14-gallon recycling container for mixed paper for each residential unit.

- Residents and businesses must purchase replacement containers or additional recycling containers.
- All containers are sold at the cost incurred and set by the Middlesex County improvement Authority (MCIA).
- The 20-gallon round bottle & can container is \$9.10.
- The 14-gallon rectangular mixed paper container is \$ 9.09
- Only cash and checks will be accepted.
Make checks payable to: The City of New Brunswick.
- A receipt will be provided.
- Damaged containers that are brought back to DPW by residents, will be replaced free of charge.

PAIN T RECYCLING

Acceptable items include: Latex, water, or oil based paints, stains, lacquers, thinners, varnish, aerosol paint & driveway sealer.

Please do not bring:

Unknown items – Unknown or unlabeled items should be taken to a Middlesex County Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off event. Call 732-745-4170 for more information.

Empty containers – Empty cans may be bagged and placed curbside for regular trash collection.

Other Items – Paintbrushes, trays, spackle, wallpaper glue, etc.

TV & COMPUTER RECYCLING

Acceptable items include: Televisions, computer monitors, CPU's PC's, laptops printers, scanners, keyboards, cables, and mouse devices.

MOTOR OIL RECYCLING

Acceptable used motor oil must be from cars trucks, motorcycles, boats & all terrain vehicles. Up to 10 quarts accepted per year, per resident.

2009 Residential SPRING LEAF & BRUSH COLLECTION INFORMATION

The Department of Public Works will collect BAGGED LEAVES ONLY the first Monday of each week from April 2009 thru May 2009. (Excluding Memorial Day).

BIODEGRADABLE LEAF BAGS

Leaf bags can be picked up at the Department of Public Works at 400 Jersey Avenue, on the dates and times listed to the right. A maximum of 20 bags will be given per property each Spring and Fall when one of the following documents are provided:

- Current drivers license with matching New Brunswick residential address.
- Current deed, tax bill or utility bill for New Brunswick residential address.
- Property owners must provide a letter authorizing individuals without a corresponding New Brunswick ID to pick up bags.
- Up to 50 additional bags may be purchased in bundles of 10 for \$3.25.
- Leaves placed in plastic bags will be accepted, however, biodegradable bags are highly recommended.
