Executive Order 2021-05

WHEREAS, during 2020 the City of New Brunswick made certain efforts to alleviate the burdens faced by its businesses due to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the City enabled a wide variety of forms of outdoor dining to maintain safe, and socially distanced dining; and

WHEREAS, the forms of outdoor dining, particularly those on George Street has proven successful; and


WHEREAS, City Market has requested a continuation of the outdoor dining on George Street; and

WHEREAS, the City shall monitor the conditions on George Street to ensure safety of patrons and fairness to the businesses not directly participating in the street closure;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, JAMES M. CAHILL, Mayor of City of New Brunswick in the County of Middlesex in the State of New Jersey, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Statutes of this State, do hereby establish the following guidelines:

1. The regulations, conditions, and standards expressed in Executive Orders 2020-13 and 2021-04 continue to be extended through Wednesday, March 31, 2021 at 11:00 p.m.
2. George Street between Church Street and Paterson Street shall be closed to vehicular traffic through Wednesday, March 31, 2021 at 11:00 p.m.
3. All restaurants and taverns that received sidewalk dining permits shall be extended until further notice.
  - a. The above extension shall conform to applicable regulations within Executive Orders 2020-01, 2020-03, 2020-06, and 2020-07.
  - b. Restaurants and taverns that continue to operate sidewalk dining must provide proof of insurance that names the City of New Brunswick as additional insured in the amount of no less than \$1 million.
4. All restaurants or taverns that are hosting outdoor dining on a closed street or within an on-street parking space, must have insurance in the amount of no less than \$2.5 million and name the City of New Brunswick as additional insured.
  - a. This information must be provided to the City of New Brunswick prior to operation of any outdoor dining.
5. All restaurants or taverns that are hosting outdoor dining within an on-street parking space (metered or otherwise) or loading zone, must receive additional permission from the New Brunswick Parking Authority prior to using said space(s) for dining.
6. Any and all of the above terms and provisions shall be subject to modification, alteration or rescission without notice and at the sole discretion of the City of New Brunswick and its agents.
7. This Executive Order shall take effect on Friday, March 12, 2021 at 9:00 a.m.
