New Brunswick Police Hiring Cycle

In anticipation of the next hiring cycle for the New Brunswick Police Department, the New Jersey Civil Service Commission is opening the application period to sign-up to take the test via the online application portal. The application can be accessed via the website, www.state.nj.us/csc. Once on the website home page in the box titled “**Job Seekers**” you will click on “**2019 Law Enforcement Announcement**”.

Law Enforcement: In order to be considered for employment in an entry-level law enforcement position, candidates must pass a written exam called the Law Enforcement Examination (LEE). Those who pass will remain in the eligible pool for two years. The pool of eligible candidates that result from the LEE will be used to fill positions for law enforcement titles in all Civil Service jurisdictions.

The New Jersey Civil Service Commission (NJCS) is opening the application period for the next LEE testing cycle on Monday, July 1, 2019 and will close the online application portal on August, 31, 2019. New Jersey has implemented a new system for the scheduling of candidates for the exam. Once you apply with the NJCS for the actual exam and application period closes, you will have the opportunity to select (based on availability) a test date, time, and location from a long list of options provided through an online portal.

The actual test dates are expected to begin as early as late September and run through October and into November 2019.

Please be advised that the position of Police Officer requires that the applicant be a resident of the City of New Brunswick. According to City of New Brunswick Ordinance 3-4f, resident means:

“...a person who has and must maintain continuous residency within the City of New Brunswick from the announced closing date of the Department of Personnel examination up to and including the date of appointment.”
